Let's take time to thank the Ordinary Heroes in our lives and pray for their safety.



Here is what to expect...

- KINDERGARTEN Kindergarten is a unique time. Our children's aspirations will change over time, but it is during these special times when they give answers to questions, they seem to be the most honest and candid that it is so much fun to hear. so we asked them to use art and answer the question, "What do you want to be when you grow up and why?"
- 1st GRADE Much like a game of chess, our kids are making choices, taking calculated risks
 and learning from mistakes. Our 1st grade project will answer the question "What makes you
 special?". The art project will be a mosaic of self portraits laid out onto a custom chess board.
 Each tile representing a self inspired portrait of themselves.
- 2nd GRADE This year, the second grade class has a garden and botanical theme. We
 played on that motif by working with the class to create a painted sunflower by applying their
 hand and thumbprints on canvas. They enjoyed having their hands painted and the tactile
 aspect of the project was a fun experience for all of them.
- 3rd GRADE The students will each design and decorate two large Jenga blocks in a pattern of shapes and colors. All the Jenga blocks will be clear coated to preserve their artistic creations and brought together to make a one of kind interactive art piece that can be shared with family and friends for years to come. The really cool part of this Jenga is that the artistic creation doesn't stop with the kids. The owners of this game can create a new art piece every time they stack the blocks up.
- 4th GRADE Water Color Hearts in a frame. The students will be using watercolor to create a
 vibrant art piece which will be a collaborative art work of 4th grade. They will be instructed to
 mix various colors on a paper and the hearts and paws will be cut out using a template for
 uniformity.
- 5th GRADE Using recycled materials, they will create Upcycled/Recycled Art. The students will create the flowers from recycled toilet paper rolls and turn these otherwise waste items into a beautiful installation. The flowers that each student creates will all be used to create a collaborative masterpiece. The finish product will provide anywhere from one to four different bidders.
- 6th GRADE Students are given a San Francisco text block section of a mural to individually decorate with any media they choose (marker, pencil, dot art, stickers, etc.). Students are encouraged to add elements that remind them of our beautiful city. Finished pieces are mounted together and framed in a 24 x 36 frame
- 7th GRADE In a dual project, the seventh graders used watercolor to capture the detail of their homes. These will be featured in a diptych. Additionally, the students painted small canvases with their take on a heart, which will be featured in a frame.
- 8th GRADE The 8th Grade Class art project is an agamograph. When you face the artwork from one side, you see each student. When you look from the other side, you see a class photo with our cherished cougar mascot. Two art pieces in one!
